REDEFINING RESTORATION

When Created Gainesville launched in 2012, our mission was to reach and restore women caught in sex trafficking and sexual exploitation. While this remains a key function of our organization, this year we strategically redefined our mission to reaching and restoring lives impacted by sex trafficking and sexual exploitation.

We realized that to combat sex trafficking in our community, we would need to address each part of why sex trafficking exists. We feel strongly that it is no longer enough to simply react to sex trafficking; rather, we believe we must take proactive steps to end it. We agreed that adopting a more targeted approach would be required to see the sex industry as a whole dissipate in Gainesville.

With this new mission in mind, we developed our key strategic approach which includes:

- Reducing the supply
- Reaching the exploited
- Restoring IIves
- Stopping the demand.

We believe each member of our community has a part to play in seeing this strategic plan executed successfully. From these 4 main focus points, we have developed our programming strategies.

- Youth Prevention
- Outreach Program
- Created Care Program/ Future Residential
- Awareness






THE WOMEN WE SERVE

Volunteer Coordinator


Laura's primary function is to recruit and manage all of Created Gainesville's volunteers. Additionally, she serves as a support in the day-to-day functions of Created Care.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Because we moved our annual fundraising event, Life Reclaimed, to the winter time, we chose to forego a 2019 event and instead focus our energy on Life Reclaimed 2020. While we did not have a large one-time fundraising event this year, we are thrilled to share that we still raised a significant amount of financial support from individuals, organizations, and churches within our community. The financial support Created Gainesville received this year enabled us to bring on two new staff members, expand our outreach efforts, and provide effective wraparound services for the women in our program. In the coming year, we strive to reach 100 Restore Partners, 20 church partners, and 20 organizational partners.

Our long-term vision remains the same: to open a long-term residential program complete with resources and services designed to equip women for a fresh start. With increased financial support, we strive to open the much needed residential program for women not only in our own community, but also statewide, who are desperately needing a place to begin their journey towards healing.
